The Award consists of a plaque acknowledging your achievements, and it is awarded in a special ceremony, which the Caribbean Philosophical Association will be organizing at its annual meeting, which will be held this June 27–30th, 2024 in Quintana Roo, Mexico:

You will also receive lifetime membership in the association and will not have to pay registration fees for attending its conferences.


